In our February newsletter, we shared a little about Sabila who needed surgery on what looked like a huge growth. Her condition is the result of a birth defect where the bones of the skull did not fuse while she was developing in the womb, thus causing 85% of her brain to grow out of her skull. On 16 February, doctors in Batam decided it was best to operate on her and removed 85% of her brain. She was in ICU for a few weeks and discharged at the end of March. The active little one is drinking well and bringing much joy to her loving parents, Pak Marlin and Ibu Damah.

Although Batam doctors have said that Sabila may need another operation soon to close up the hole in her head, the last review on 15 April 2017 showed some promise that it was healing and closing gradually on its own. We are elated to hear this news and pray for the best for this lovely miracle.

The other good news is that Sabila's medical bills are fully covered by the Public Health Department. 5 miles helps with practical needs such as transport to and from the hospital. Pak Marlin also needs to find work in the area of servicing and repairing airconditioners or an alternative vocation. He is amiable and speaks English moderately well.

OUR KIDS ARE GROWING UP!

Four of our children living in the orphanages/homes will be taking their Class 6 exams in May and moving up to Junior High School in July. Two of our older children aged 15 and 16 will be taking their Junior High School exams and entering Senior High School in July as well. Please keep all six in prayer as they prepare for the national exams. We have identified the schools for them to enrol in July. Registration alone for the Christian Junior High School (Batam) is more than \$600 for the first year per student and monthly fees could cost as much as \$50 per student. We have appealed for a subsidised rate and are awaiting approval from the school board.





BINTAN KINDERGARTEN NEEDS A NEW BUILDING

We believe that not only is education important for the poor to break out of the poverty cycle, but it is also important to start them young. At Petra, children (K1 and K2) learn positive values such as discipline, diligence and honesty.

5miles is helping to raise funds for Petra kindergarten in Tanjung Uban which needs a new building by June when it vacates the current rented shophouse. Construction of the new school has begun but funds are insufficient to complete the building. Please pray for the 70 students currently in the school. 
